

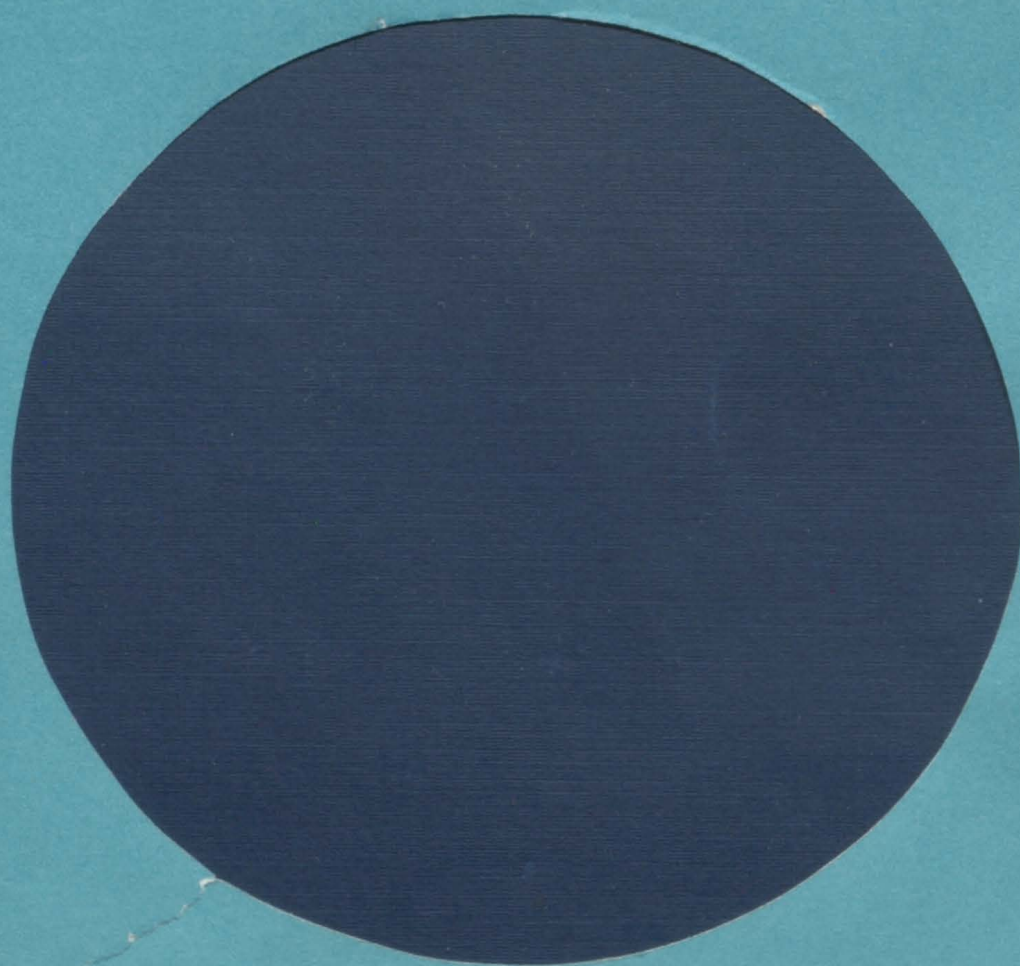

To the Class of 1952:

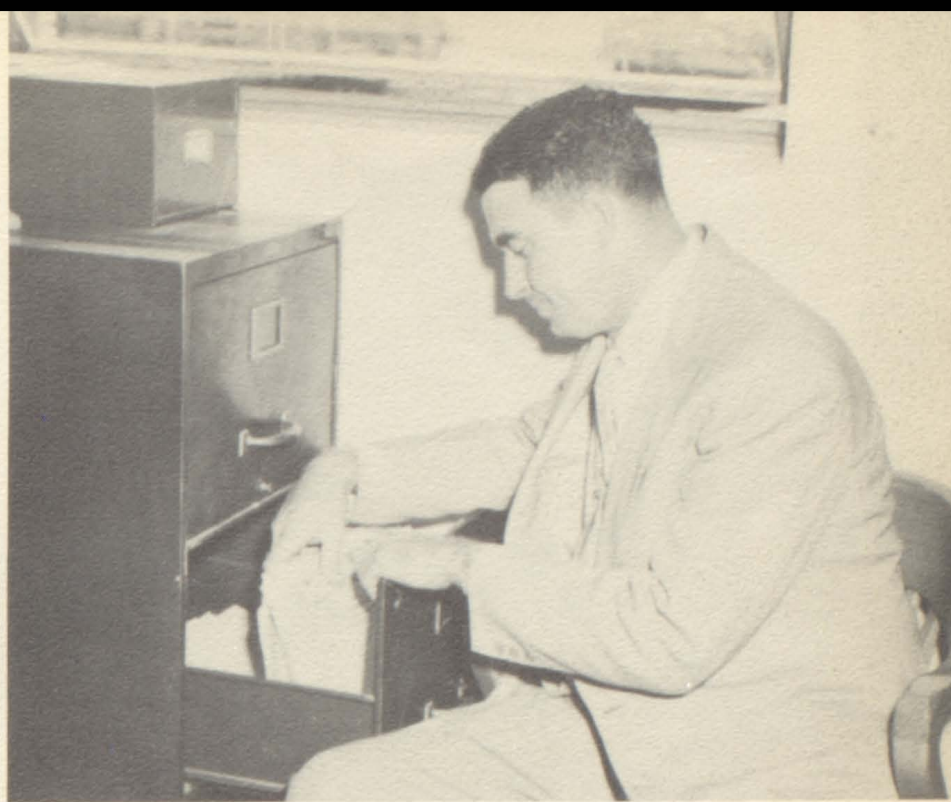
It is with a deep feeling of appreciation that I say to you, it has been an honor to have been associated with you this year.

The group went by bus to Fort Worth on Friday, October 5, spent the night, attended the Fair on Saturday, spent Saturday night in Fort Worth and came home on Sunday. The group was accompanied by the advisors, Mr. and Mrs. James Risinger.

The Future Homemakers and Future Farmers had charge of the concession stand at the Harvest Carnival. They sold hot dogs, sandwiches, cake, pie, coffee, hot chocolate, cold drinks, peanuts, and candy, and made a net profit of about \$50.

On November 10, Betty Caughey, Patsy Gay, Edith Harrell, and Mrs. Risinger attended the District IV Meeting in Sterling City.

Installation of new officers was held in the study hall on Thursday night, November 16. The installation ceremony was conducted by the Ack-erly Future Homemakers in a candle light ceremony. F. F. A. ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The F. F. A. boys' year of work under the supervision of James Risinger has been interesting and productive.

Eight boys have fifteen lambs for show: Charles Adams--2, Truman Tate--2, Charles Burks--2, Carlos Rameriz--2, Leonard Smith--3, Bobby Bayes--1, Pee Wee Shortes--1, and Doyle Railsback--2. These lambs were bought September 29 and put on feed.

Two pigs were shown by Bobby Bayes and three by Charles Williams at the Howard County Fair. Other boys that have pigs for the next show are: Grady Grantham--2, Leonard Smith--2, Red Adams--2, Bobby Bayes--2, and Pee Wee Shortes--2.

Other things that the boys have done this year are: Made about two field trips each week, and about twenty attended the Dallas Fair. On the field trips the boys have castrated 20 pigs, dehorned 9 lambs, castrated 6 calves, dehorned 19 calves and 5 cows. These cows were dehorned with the new type wire-dehorner which worked successfully.

At the Harvest Carnival, the F. F. A. and the F. H. A. had charge of the food booth which netted about 57 dollars to be used for the two groups.

The F. F. A. entertained the F. H. A. with a weiner roast at the home of the sponsor in October. About 50 attended.

The boys selected Joe Sample as F. F. A. Dream Girl, whose picture will be in the 1952 Hillbilly Capers.
