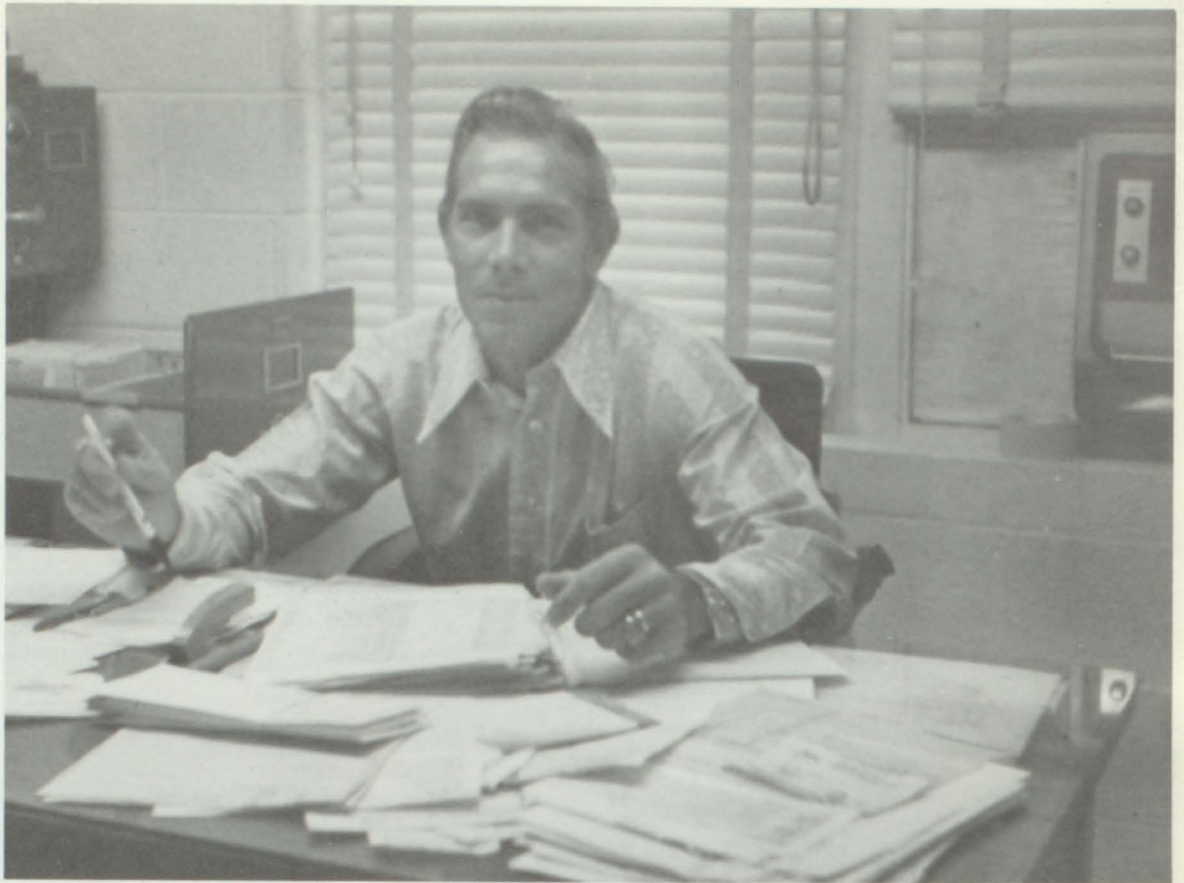
PROLOGUE
