



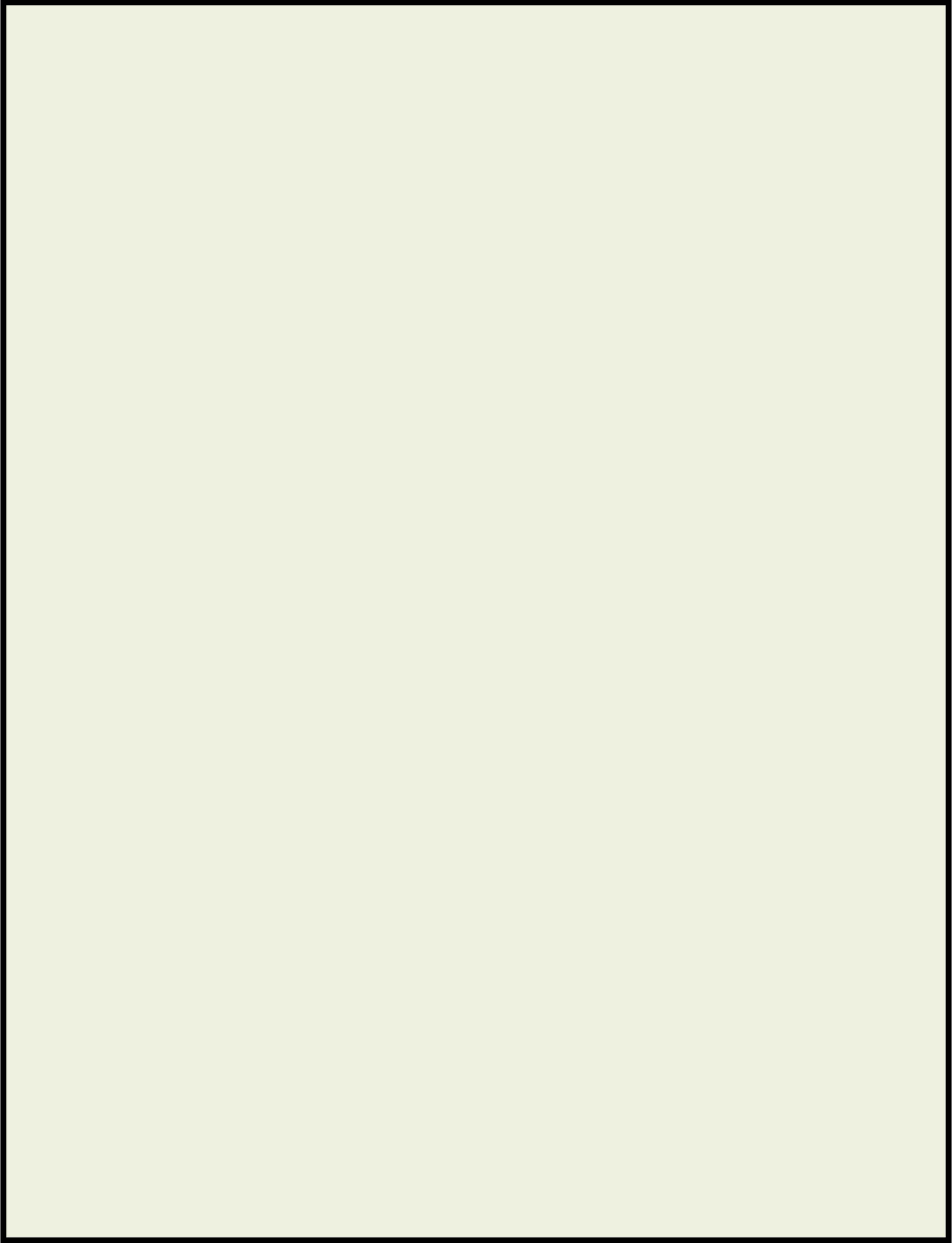

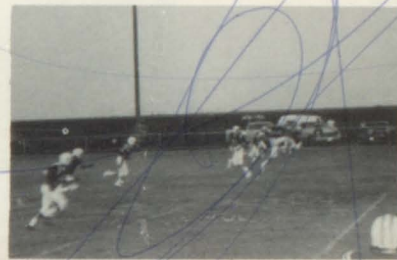

The seniors of 1976 have chosen to dedicate this bicentennial yearbook to their parents. Without their time, money, advice, and love, we would not have reached our goal.

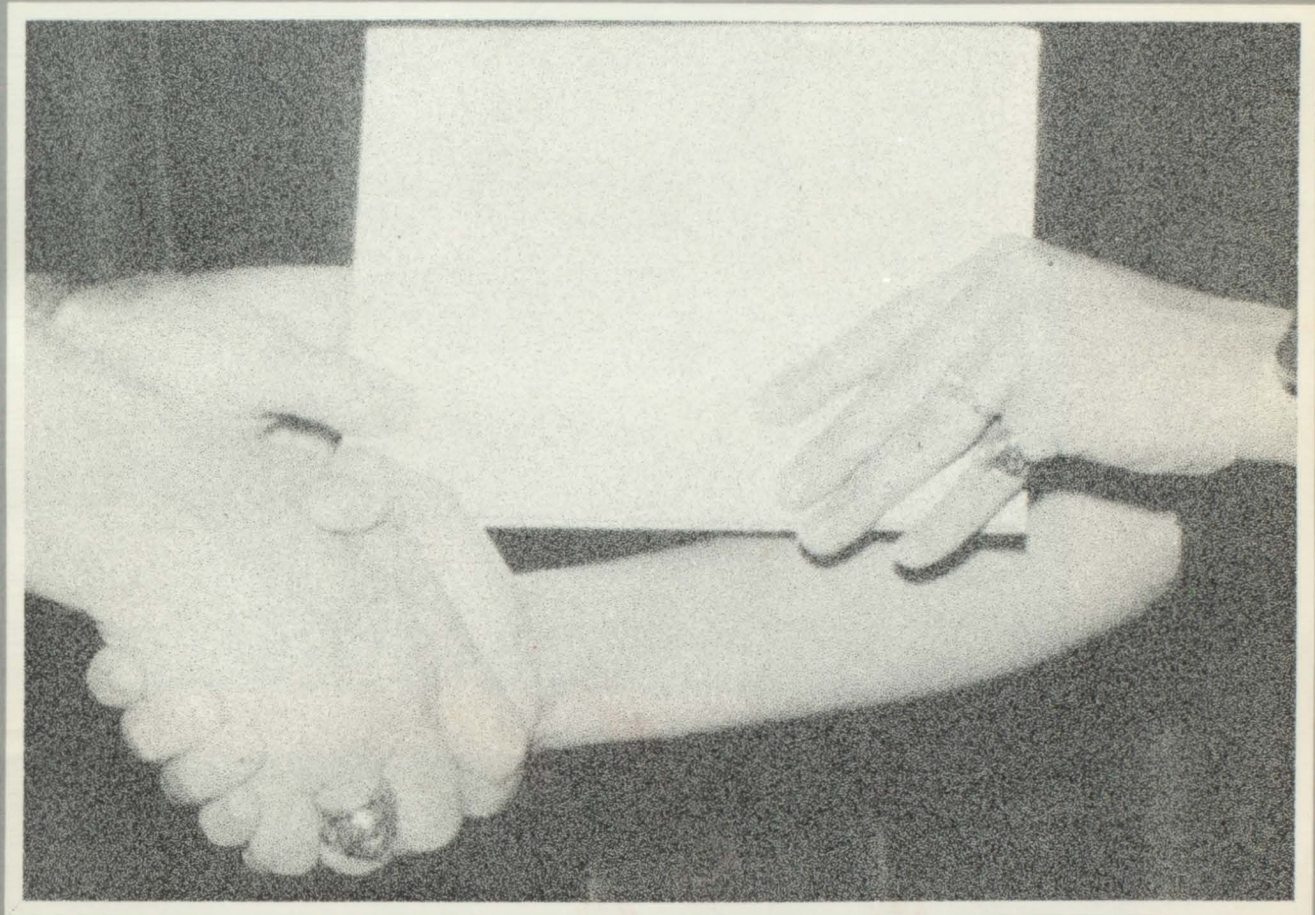

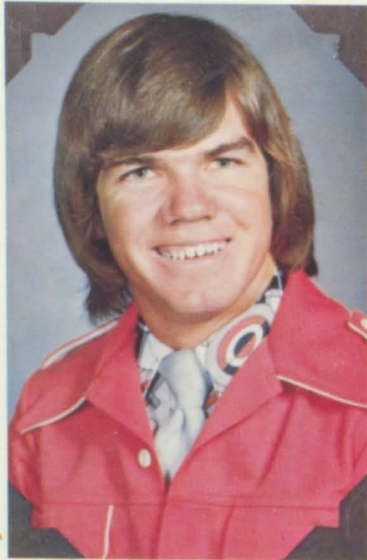


Who says Seniors aren't stacked?

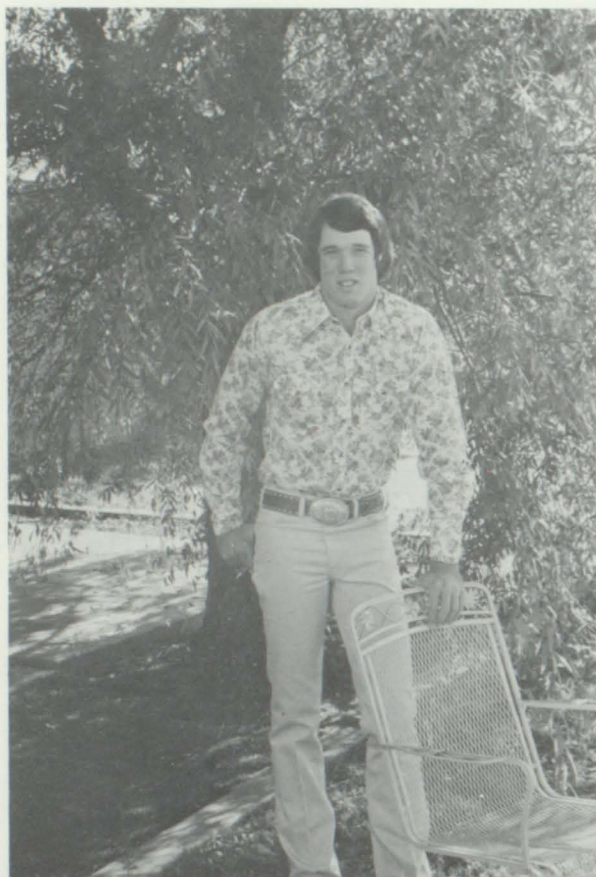
ROYALISTS



The Seal of the United States, adopted June 20, 1782, symbolizes the sovereignty of the United States. The face bears an American eagle, with a shield on its breast, symbolizing America's self-reliance. The 13 vertical stripes on the shield represent the 13 original colonies. The blue chief above the stripes symbolize Congress, but since 1789, the blue chief has been meant to mean all branches of the government. The eagle holds an olive branch of 13 leaves and 13 olives in its right talon, and 13 arrows in its left. It prefers to live in peace, but can wage war as well. The words E Pluribus Unum mean 'One composed of many'—The United States of America.

LOYALISTS



The Liberty Bell rang July 8, 1776, with other church bells, to announce the adoption of the Declaration of Independence. Inscribed upon the bell is a quote from the Bible: "Proclaim Liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof." It was first cast in England in 1752 for the State House in Philadelphia. It broke in ringing after its arrival and was recast in Philadelphia from the same metal, with the same inscription, in 1753. It rang every year on the anniversary of the adoption of the Declaration until 1835. It broke that year. It is no longer rung, but it has been struck on special occasions, and remains as a symbol of American independence.

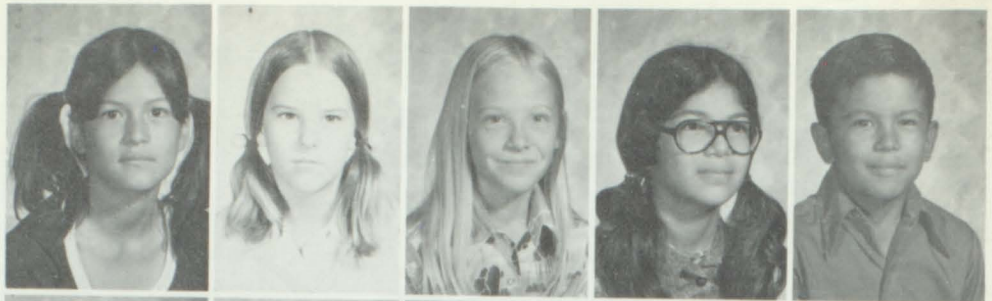
The United States Constitution is the supreme law of the land. Convention delegates signed the Constitution September 17, 1787. They agreed that the new government could be organized after nine states had approved the Constitution. This took place in January, 1789. By December 15, 1791, 10 amendments were approved and added to the Constitution. These are the Bill of Rights which are designed to protect individual liberties against possible encroachment by the new government. This Constitution establishes the federal system of separating powers between the states and the national government. It also divides the powers of the government among the executive, legislative, and judicial branches.
